Origami Frog...


You will need...

- Origami Frog Template (Found at the back of this pack)
- Coloured pens or pencils



How to make...

1. Colour in the template.

Make It!

Pinata...

You will need...

- Cereal box
- Scissors
- Sweets
- Tissue paper / thin coloured or plain paper
- Glue
- String / ribbon



How to make...

1. Take your empty cereal box and cut out the front and back. Don't cut all the way to the edge as you need some space to stick your paper down.
2. Stick the top of the box down so it doesn't open.
3. Cut some tissue paper, coloured paper, or plain paper into 4 long strips.
4. Once you have your strips, make cuts along the edge to create a fringe look.
5. Place your sweets into the bottom of your cereal box
6. Wrap the cereal box with the paper. Layer the paper up over the box using glue.
7. Attach some ribbon or string to your Pinata.
8. Try to hit the cereal box until the sweets fall out.

Sun set shadow...

You will need...

- Coloured paper or coloured pencils
- Glue
- Objects to make shadows
- Camera

How to make...

1. Design your sunset by either sticking down strips of coloured paper or using your coloured pencils.
2. Find some objects to cast shadows onto the paper.







Drawn your own Manga character...

How to make...

1. Follow the diagrams below and take a look at the top tips!
- Decide if your character is male or female. For females, add eyelashes and colour to the lips.
 - Draw choppy, chin length hair for males and longer hair for females.
 - Add a simple line to depict the nose on male characters, with nostrils for the female.
 - Add a jagged eyebrow if your character is a villain.
 - Add extra details to show how your character is feeling: rosy cheeks and steam for anger, a wide smile and closed eyes for happiness, tears pouring down the face for sadness.
 - To depict negative emotions, keep the pupils small; large pupils depict positive emotions.
 - Add an unnatural colour, such as blue or purple to the hair.

Bake It!

Homemade Pizza

Ingredients

Dough:

- 560g of strong white flour
- 1 sachet of yeast
- 1 tablespoon of oil
- 1 tablespoon of sugar
- Pinch of salt
- 350ml of room temperature water

Topping:

- Tomato Base
- Cheese
- Toppings of your choice

Equipment

- 2 Large Bowls
- Measuring Jug
- Baking tray
- Tea Towel
- Rolling Pin



1. To make the dough by hand. Mix the flour, yeast and salt together in a large mixing bowl and stir in the olive oil.
2. Gradually add the water, mixing well to form a soft dough.
3. Place the dough out onto a floured work surface and knead for about five minutes, until smooth and elastic.
4. Transfer to a clean bowl, and cover with a damp tea towel. Leave to rise for about 1½ hours until doubled in size.
5. When the dough has risen, push down in the centre, then knead again until smooth.
6. Roll into a ball and set aside for 30 minutes to 1 hour until risen again.
7. Roll out on a floured surface to your chosen size. (This can potentially make up to 3 12inch pizzas)
8. At this point, preheat the oven to 170
9. Spread the tomato base onto your rolled-out pizza.
10. Sprinkle the cheese on top and add your chosen toppings.
11. Bake the pizzas in the oven until the bases are crisp and golden-brown around the edges and any cheese on the topping has melted. (The time it takes will vary based on the size of your pizza)
12. Enjoy your pizza together as a family!

Bake It!

Egyptian Banana Bread

Ingredients:

- 140g butter, plus extra to grease the tin
- 140g caster sugar
- 2 eggs
- 140g self-raising flour
- 1tsp Baking Powder
- 2 ripe bananas, mashed
- 50g icing sugar

Equipment

- Loaf tin/ tin
- Large bowl
- Small Bowl
- Wooden spoon
- Sieve
- Skewer or Knife

1. Pre heat the oven to 180c/ Gas mark 4.
2. Butter the loaf tin or tin you are using.
3. Cream the butter and sugar until light and fluffy.
4. Slowly add the eggs.
5. Sieve the flour in and fold together.
6. Add the baking powder and mashed bananas.
7. Pour into the tin and bake for 30 mins, or until a skewer/knife comes out clean.
8. Allow to cool for 10 mins in the tin, then leave to cool on a cooling rack or plate.
9. Mix the icing sugar with 2-3tsp of water to make runny icing. Once the cake is completely cooled drizzle on the icing.



FUN FACT: Banana Bread can be traced back to 4000b.c and was created by the ancient Egyptians!




