Make It!

Alaskan Inuit...

You will need...

- Paper
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Glue
- Bun case
- Cotton wool
- Coloured pencils



How to make...

1. Draw a simple coat outline (like the picture above) on a piece of paper and cut it out.
2. Find a circular object, draw around it and cut it out. This will be your face.
3. Get your bun case and flatten it. Now stick your circle onto the bun case to give your Inuit a hood.
4. Stick the head to the coat and decorate it with cotton wool.
5. Now add the final touches like a face, hair and maybe some gloves!

Scarecrow...

You will need...

- Cardboard tube
- Coloured paper or plain paper to colour in
- Scissors
- Glue
- Items to decorate (optional)

How to make...

1. Cut a strip of paper wide enough to cover half of your cardboard tube.
2. Stick the paper onto your tube to create a top for the scarecrow.
3. Now add finishing touches like a face or a patch.



Make It!

Royal Crown...

You will need...

- Crown template (At the back of this pack)
- Scissors
- Tape
- Glue
- Colouring pencils
- Items to decorate (e.g. foil, scrap pieces of card, stickers etc)



How to make...

1. Cut out the crown template and stick the two pieces of the crown together with glue or tape. Only do this on one end so you can trim the crown.
2. Measure the crown by wrapping it around your head and marking where the excess paper needs to be cut off.
3. Take the crown off of your head and cut off the excess paper – allow some overlap between the pieces so it can be stuck together.
4. Decorate your crown.
5. When you have finished decorating, stick the crown together with glue or tape.

Mardi Gras Masks...

You will need...

- Mask template (At the back of this pack)
- Cardboard (cereal box is perfect)
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Glue
- Colouring pencils and items to decorate (optional)



How to make...


1. Choose a mask template and cut it out.
2. Get some cardboard, draw around the template, and cut it out of the cardboard. Don't forget to cut out the eyes!
3. Either colour in the paper template and stick it onto the cardboard or decorate the cardboard on its own.
4. If you have something to use as a stick to hold the mask, attach it to the back on the mask.





Bake It!

Homemade Pizza

Ingredients

Dough:

- 560g of strong white flour
- 1 sachet of yeast
- 1 tablespoon of oil
- 1 tablespoon of sugar
- Pinch of salt
- 350ml of room temperature water

Topping:

- Tomato Base
- Cheese
- Toppings of your choice

Equipment

- 2 Large Bowls
- Measuring Jug
- Baking tray
- Tea Towel
- Rolling Pin



1. To make the dough by hand. Mix the flour, yeast and salt together in a large mixing bowl and stir in the olive oil.
 2. Gradually add the water, mixing well to form a soft dough.
3. Place the dough out onto a floured work surface and knead for about five minutes, until smooth and elastic.
4. Transfer to a clean bowl, and cover with a damp tea towel. Leave to rise for about 1½ hours until doubled in size.
5. When the dough has risen, push down in the centre, then knead again until smooth.
6. Roll into a ball and set aside for 30 minutes to 1 hour until risen again.
7. Roll out on a floured surface to your chosen size. (This can potentially make up to 3 12inch pizzas)
 8. At this point, preheat the oven to 170
 9. Spread the tomato base onto your rolled-out pizza.
 10. Sprinkle the cheese on top and add your chosen toppings.
11. Bake the pizzas in the oven until the bases are crisp and golden-brown around the edges and any cheese on the topping has melted. (The time it takes will vary based on the size of your pizza)
 12. Enjoy your pizza together as a family!



Bake It!

Egyptian Banana Bread

Ingredients:

- 140g butter, plus extra to grease the tin
- 140g caster sugar
- 2 eggs
- 140g self-raising flour
- 1tsp Baking Powder
- 2 ripe bananas, mashed
- 50g icing sugar

Equipment

- Loaf tin/ tin
- Large bowl
- Small Bowl
- Wooden spoon
- Sieve
- Skewer or Knife

1. Pre heat the oven to 180c/ Gas mark 4.
2. Butter the loaf tin or tin you are using.
3. Cream the butter and sugar until light and fluffy.
4. Slowly add the eggs.
5. Sieve the flour in and fold together.
6. Add the baking powder and mashed bananas.
7. Pour into the tin and bake for 30 mins, or until a skewer/knife comes out clean.
8. Allow to cool for 10 mins in the tin, then leave to cool on a cooling rack or plate.
9. Mix the icing sugar with 2-3tsp of water to make runny icing. Once the cake is completely cooled drizzle on the icing.




FUN FACT: Banana Bread can be traced back to 4000b.c and was created by the ancient Egyptians!


